## College prep class explores the path to success



Brandon has a clear path in mind for his career. "I'm trying to build up my skills," he says, "and I think college will help me get where I want to go."

Brandon's coach **Yuki Li** thinks he's on the right track for a future in Computer Science, and suggested The Arc's College Preparation course along with the SF City College classes he's selected for the fall semester.

Arc course designer **Kim Thelen** notes that her college prep class addresses the many barriers and opportunities that students with developmental disabilities may expect. Participants visit college campuses and learn about the simple accommodations—like note takers and extra time on tests—that can make all the difference in achieving success.

Says Li, "I'm here to help Brandon access whatever he needs to reach his goals. Whether it's help with studying or financial aid, we can make this work."

## Jonah steps up to the challenge at Mixpanel

#### "My job is to make people feel comfortable."

From day one, Jonah, 21, said that his job as Office Assistant at Mixpanel was more than keeping the kitchens stocked and the conference rooms organized. He saw his role as integral to the well-being of everyone around him at the product analytics company located in downtown San Francisco. And co-workers say that he brings that sense of responsibility to work every day.

His direct supervisor, **Aaron Cuadra**, notes that having a team player willing to pitch in wherever needed is just right for Mixpanel's fast-paced environment.

"Jonah does a little bit of everything here and I've upped his role to onboarding and setting up computers. Plus he helps us with reception whenever we need backup," says Cuadra.

Jonah's Arc Job Coach, Vivien Ovadya, is proud of his progress since his early days on the job. He no longer needs the task checklist created for him and notes that he's willing to do all that it takes to expand his skill set and exceed expectations.

Cuadra agrees. "Every time I give him something new, he steps up to the challenge. I'm teaching him to be a facilities manager someday, and I think his role here can only grow. I want to open more doors for employee that they can be part of the workforce—that's why we have such an amazing partnership with The Arc."

In May, Mixpanel was recognized with The Arc San Francisco Technology Employer Award given to tech companies who are champions for a more inclusive workplace. We congratulate Jonah, Aaron and their colleagues at Mixpanel on their success.

### Dad's memories find a home in Roman's new place

Roman misses his dad every day since his passing last year, but thinks he would have been proud of all he's achieved through the support of The Arc and other community partners.

Roman's team helped him apply for an apartment in Mercy Housing's new Bill Sorro Community on 6th and Howard, SF, and he was selected from a lottery of over 1,500 applicants. He moved into his 1-bedroom unit in May, and still finds it a shock to wake up in a place of his own.

"At first I had trouble sleeping, but now I'm used to it—it feels amazing," says Roman, who also graduated from an Arc internship program at Royal Auto in June.

The Arc's Residential Services Manager, Steve Wallace, is helping Roman adjust to his new life with weekly check-ins around budgeting, spending and dealing with new neighbors.

"The Arc really cares about me," says Roman, "and I know my dad is looking down on me, too."

#### Filling the gap in Alzheimer's & dementia care

What is the difference between normal aging and dementia? How do I plan for the future of my loved one? Where can I go for help?

With the growing population of individuals with dementia across the U.S., service providers and families are facing a crisis in care that is tougher still among those with developmental disabilities. In particular, adults with Down syndrome develop Alzheimer's disease at greater rates, challenging caregivers struggling to determine signs of

typical aging versus more serious symptoms of disease.

To fill the gap in the care system for people living with Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders (ADRD), the SF Department of Aging and Adult Services, in partnership with the Alzheimer's Association, The Arc San Francisco and UCSF have teamed up to implement a 3-year training and support system for caregivers and service providers.

Arc SF Project Lead Kristin Rains reports that the 3-year initiative includes a "Savvy Caregivers" training for families, the "Alzheimer's Care Academy" for service providers, and dementia screenings in partnership with the UCSF Memory and Aging Clinic.

Clients of The Arc SF identified as at risk for ADRD and their families will participate in the project, as well as other at risk individuals with developmental disabilities in the community and their families.
